***INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS IN THE 21st CENTURY
June 21 - 26***

In the framework of the activities started with the First Academic Career Days (2006 and 2007) and the Conference Cycle (2008) our analysis will be focused on 2010, through a cycle of Conferences which will count with the participation of national and international colleagues, who are specialized in the field of International Relations of and in the 21st Century.

The first decade of the millennium, International Relations have become more dense and complex than the ones of the last four centuries of existence of the International System and the world economic space.

This time, with the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of the School of International Affairs, we plan to address the International Relations of and in the 21st Century, by taking into account a broad spectrum of Actors and their interaction with the economic, human and technological flows, present in the International System.

Considering the transformations that have been happening since the last third of this century, not only in the International System, but also in the logic that explains the Global economy, the analysis of the International Relations has had to deal with new topics (environmental issues, for example) as well as with those which are as old and classic as the discipline itself; however, they also reappear along with new manifestations, such as the Power in the International System, or Security issues, for

example.

Therefore, we are able to work on topics such as:

- 1) **International Relations of the 21st Century:** studying them through an analysis of the International System, theories on International Relations, International Justice.
- 2) **Actors in International Relations:** States' Foreign Policies, International Organizations; non-state legal actors -multinationals, the civil society-; non-state illegal actors and the presence of criminal organizations; regions; geo-economic zones and sub-state units.
- 3) **International Relations challenges in the 21st Century:** the -productive, commercial, monetary, financial, technological- economy; information economy and information society; climate change, environment and sustainable development; regionalisms and International Relations; ongoing conflicts and new security manifestations; nationalisms and post-nationalisms.
